

Firecracker 50 Seward, Nebraska

Held in conjunction with Seward, Nebraska's 4th of July Celebration, the Firecracker 50 is a lightly supported bicycle ride open to the public, without charge, sponsored by the Great Plains Bicycling Club. Lightly supported means that a SAG support station with water supplies and a limited selection of snack foods will be provided along the route. The ride is on paved roads.

The ride starts at The Living Word Lutheran Church, 1300 W. Hillcrest Drive in Seward



Nebraska. At the conclusion of the ride, the municipal pool showers will be available without charge for those wishing to freshen up and change clothes (bring your own towel).

Riders may choose the full ride distance (about 50 miles) or

any lesser distance. This is not a race (unless that's how you're wired) so feel free to ride any of the distances at any pace that you find comfortable. All ages are welcome however riders under 18 years old must ride with a parent or guardian.
